**NOTIFICATION**

BOMBAY PROHIBITION ACT, 1949.

No. BPA. 1108/CR-23/EXC-3.—Whereas, the Government of Maharashtra considers that the following rules further to amend the Bombay Foreign Liquor and Rectified Spirit (Transport) Fees Rules, 1954, should be brought into force at once, and therefore, the rules should be made without previous publication as provided by the proviso to sub-section (3) of section 143 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949);

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-clauses (b), (f) and (u) of sub-section (2) read with the proviso to sub-section (3) of section 143 of the Bombay Prohibition Act, 1949 (Bom. XXV of 1949), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Government of Maharashtra hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Bombay Foreign Liquor and Rectified Spirit (Transport) Fees Rules, 1954, as follows, namely :—

1. These rules may be called the Bombay Foreign Liquor and Rectified Spirit (Transport) Fees (Amendment) Rules, 2008.

2. In rule 4 of the Bombay Foreign Liquor and Rectified Spirit (Transport) Fees Rules, 1954, in sub-rule (b),—

(a) under the heading “ Rates of special fee ”, for clauses (i), (ii) and (iii), the following clauses shall be substituted, namely :—

“ (i) 200 per cent. of the manufacturing cost or Rs. 300.00 per bulk litre, whichever is higher for the Spirits.

(ii) 200 per cent. of the manufacturing cost of Rs. 200.00 per bulk litre, whichever is higher for wine either in bottle or in bulk.

(iii) (a) 100 per cent. of the manufacturing cost of Rs. 15.00 per bulk litre, whichever is higher for mild beer ;

(b) 125 per cent. of the manufacturing cost or Rs. 20.00 per bulk litre, whichever is higher for fermented beer.”

(b) Explanation, shall be deleted.
