The birth of a classic Nine Hills, one of the best-loved wines in India, was born in Nashik and is named after the nine hills that surround the scenic city.

It is owned by Pernod Ricard
(formerly Seagram's India), the
company that is renowned for
bestselling wines like Jacob's
Creek (Australia), Long
Mountain (South Africa)
and Montana (New Zealand)
and world-class spirits like
Chivas Regal, Glenlivet and
100 Pipers.

Four delightful varietals Nine

Hills is made in the best vineyards of Nashik under

the expert eye of master French winemaker Jean

Manuel Jacquinot. It offers two exquisite varietals

each in both red and white.

The Nine Hills Cabernet Sauvignon has a rich red terracotta colour with purple highlights and hints of cherry, vanilla and capsicum aromas. Its well-balanced acidity and soft tannins charm the palate and leave a lingering finish.

The Nine Hills Shiraz has a deep red colour with hints of violet. This full-bodied wine with soft velvety tannins expresses fruity notes of cherry and strawberry.

Among the whites, the Nine Hills Sauvignon Blanc is an elegant pale golden wine with pronounced aromas of passion fruit, pineapple and fresh lime while the off-dry Chenin Blanc has light floral and fruity aromas.

Making waves Nine Hills is already making its presence felt among connoisseurs. The Indian Wine Challenge 2007 recently awarded the Nine Hills Cabernet Sauvignon (Vintage 2007) the coveted title of 'The finest Indian Red Wine'. The Nine Hills Shiraz (Vintage 2007) wasn't far behind and got the prestigious Seal of Approval. In the maiden Business Today More (bt more) tasting challenge, where 38 labels participated, the Nine Hills Chenin Blanc and Cabernet Sauvignon were

among the best white and red wines respectively.
